John Tonsfeldt and Steve Anderson present to discuss the restrictions by DNR on hunting the Canada goose in the area on Big Spirit Lake. They stated that the increase in Canada goose population was causing a change to the ecology of the area and they feel the restriction on Canada goose hunting should be removed. Following discussion, it was moved by Northey, seconded by Jordan to send a letter of support to the DNR that they use whatever method possible including the opening of the Canadian goose hunting season in Dickinson County in order to improve the quality of the water of the lakes and the ecology of Dickinson County. The Board of Supervisors of Dickinson County, Iowa, met in regular session, in the Dickinson County Expo Center, 1602 15th Street, Spirit Lake, Iowa at 10:00 am. on August 22, 2006. There were present Chairperson David Gottsche, in the chair, and the following named Board Members: Mardi Allen, Paul Johnson, Pam Jordan and Wayne Northey. Absent-none.

The Chairperson announced that this was the time and place for the public hearing g and meeting on the matter of the issuance of not to exceed \$6,500,000 Senior Housing Revenue Bonds, in order to provide funds for the purpose of financing the costs of land acquisition and constructing, equipping and furnishing a senior housing facility located within the Issuer at 2810 Aurora Avenue, Spirit Lake, Iowa, consisting of approximately 42 assisted living units and approximately 20 memory loss units (the "Project") and paying costs of issuance and related costs, and that notice of the proposed action by the Board to institute proceedings for the issuance of said bonds, had been published pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 419 of the Code of Iowa.

The Chairperson then asked the Auditor whether any written objections had been filed by any county resident or property owners to the issuance of said bonds. That auditor advised that no written objections had been filed. The Chairperson then called for oral objections to the issuance of said bonds and none were made. Whereupon, the Chairperson declared the time for receiving oral and written objections to be closed.

The Board then considered the proposed action and the extent of objections thereto. Whereupon, Board Member Pam Jordan introduced and delivered to the Auditor the Resolution hereinafter set out entitled "RESOLUTION INSTITUTING PROCEEDINGS TO TAKE ADDITIONAL ACTION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$6,500,000 SENIOR HOUSING REVENUE BONDS", and moved its adoption. Board Member Paul Johnson seconded the motion to adopt. The roll was called and the vote was,

AYES: Johnson, Allen, Jordan, Northey, Gottsche NAYS: None

Whereupon, the Chairperson declared said Resolution duly adopted as follows: RESOLUTION INSTITUTING PROCEEDINGS TO TAKE ADDITIONAL ACTION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$5,600,000 SENIOR HOUSING REVENUE BONDS

WHEREAS, pursuance to notice published as required by law, this Board has held a public meeting and hearing upon the proposal to institute proceedings for the issuance of not to exceed \$6,500,000 Senior Housing Revenue bonds, for the purpose of financing the costs of land acquisition and constructing, equipping and furnishing a senior housing facility located within the Issuer at 2810 Aurora Avenue, Spirit Lake, Iowa, consisting of approximately 42 assisted living units and approximately 20 memory loss units (the "Project") and paying costs of issuance and related costs, and has considered the extent of objections received from residents or property owners as to said proposed issuance of bonds; and, accordingly the following action is now considered to be in the best interests of the County and residents thereof:

NOW, THEREFORE, BNE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISROS OF DICKINSON COUNTY, IWOA:

Section 1. That this Board does hereby institute proceedings and take additional action for the sale and issuance in the manner required by law of not to exceed \$6,500,000 Senior Housing Revenue Bonds, for the foregoing described Project and purposes.

Section 2. The Chairperson and Auditor are authorized and directed to proceed on behalf of the County with the sale of said bonds, to select a date for the sale thereof, to cause to be prepared such notice and sale information as may appear appropriate, to publish and distribute the same on behalf of the County and this Board and otherwise to take all action necessary to permit the sale of said bonds on a basis favorable to the County and acceptable to the Board. PASSED AND APPROVED this 22nd day of August, 2006.

Earl Maahs and Jerry Jones present to request the Board approve the

agreement for redevelopment with the City of Orleans, Jerry F. Jones and Dickinson County in conjunction with the urban renewal project. Moved by

Northey, seconded by Allen to approve the agreement for private redevelopment by and between Dickinson County, Iowa and City of Orleans and Jerry F. Jones pursuant to Chapter 403 Code of Iowa. All voted aye.

Owner's Representative present with weekly update on courthouse construction project. Presented is Change Order 39 for the scrutiny doors and was decided to delay action on this request until after the construction meeting this week.

Time for the receiving of bids for the removal of the buildings located on the property purchased by the County, known as the Ferguson property. No bids were received. It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Northey to revise and republish a notice to bidders for the removal of the former Ferguson building, with the terms of the bidding to be the same as previously published with the removal date of May 1, 2007 with the bids to be turned in by Friday, September 15, 2006 at 4:30 P.M. and to be opened at the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors at 10:00 A.M. on September 19, 2006. All voted aye.

Supervisor Jordan presented a request for proposal for service for Facilities and Equipment Management. She proposed to advertise the rfp the week of August 28 with proposals to the Auditor's office by the 15th of September and on the Board agenda on the 19th of September. Moved by Johnson, seconded by Allen to accept the recommendations as presented and to advertise the taking of bids. All voted aye.

County Engineer present. Board discussed the acceptance of 193rd Avenue, West Sioux Estates Road, into the Secondary Road System. This road is part of the West Sioux Estates Urban Renewal project. Moved by Northey, seconded by Allen to approve the recommendation to accept 193rd Avenue, also known as West Sioux Estates road, into the Secondary Road System. In addition, the county will place the appropriate signing which will include a stop sign at the intersection of A34 and $193^{\rm rd}$ Avenue. There being questions on the funding of the improvements to the road, the board decided to consult with the county attorney before accepting into the Secondary Road System, so Northey withdrew the motion and Allen withdrew the second. Action to be taken at a later meeting.

Rosalise Olson, County Attorney, Jeff Hansen, Spirit Lake Police Chief and Ron Vincelli, representing ADTU, presented a Disorderly House Ordinance that they are proposing the county adopt. The Board reviewed the ordinance and asked the county attorney to change the language of the ordinance to include open spaces and that it be back on the agenda in three weeks.

Bob Vernon, representing the Dickinson County Taxpayers Association present to discuss a feasibility study for the sharing of services between the ten cities of the county and the County. The Taxpayers Association would fund the study and there would be no cost to the county taxpayers. Mr. Vernon presented letters of support for the project from the cities to be involved. Moved by Northey seconded by Allen to send a letter in support of the study for the sharing of services in Dickinson County at no cost to the county. Roll call voted was requested: AYES: Jordan, Johnson, Northey, Allen NAYS: Gottsche Motion carried.

There being no further business presented before the board, it was moved by Jordan, seconded by Allen to adjourn. All present voted aye.
